

Title of BIP: International Summer School in Social Anthropology, 12th Edition: *Urban Sociology and Social Anthropology on the Spot - Timișoara*

General information

Objectives and Description:

Objectives:

OB1. Knowledge, understanding and description of abstract concepts, theories and social research methodologies based on empirical research results. [To select suitable methods, techniques and procedures for context-sensitive social research based on the need assessment analysis. To design sociological research inquiries (collecting data, social data analysis) in communities]

OB2. Operationalising key concepts for the explanatory and interpretative analysis of social phenomena in a real-life situation. [To elaborate on social diagnosis and understand public urban policies, considering the real-life social and cultural context]

OB3. Develop the following transversal competencies / transferable skills:

- Collaboration in international teams [To learn from the diversity of cultural and educational backgrounds in the team of students, to use the team members' experience, skills, and knowledge to accomplish the learning goals. To communicate and collaborate with international students, bridging cultural distances. To use information and data in an immersive team-based international context]
- Communication and language skills [To be actively involved in communication, to encourage communication, to be comfortable in communication, to receive and give feedback to peers. To practice the English language outside of the English class, in a real-life international learning context]
- Reflective learning [To reflect on what and how the student is learning. To learn how to become a better learner and become aware of one's own strengths and weaknesses in the collaborative international learning setting.]

Description:

The *International Summer School in Social Anthropology* is held at the Department of Sociology, Faculty of Sociology and Social Work, West University of Timișoara, Romania. It brings together international students of social sciences from at least five European universities. The participant students attend theoretical and preparatory online synchronous sessions. They are guided through one week of anthropological fieldwork in various living areas of the city and metropolitan area of Timișoara by teachers from the West University of Timișoara (Romania), the Norwegian University of Science and Technology (Norway), the University of Messina (Italy), the University of Beira Interior (Portugal), and the University of Fribourg (Switzerland). Through the daily onsite visits, the international teams of students have the opportunity to learn about social and cultural life in Timișoara, express and share their knowledge and ideas, make comparisons with the European cities they come from and value the cultural exchange the BIP provides, while applying the anthropological method through participatory observation, transect walks, individual and group reflective activities.

Methods and outcomes:

Teaching and learning **methods**: Team-based international learning, Explanatory and interpretative discussions on global social problems by using real-life cases, and Group reflective learning

Assignment and **outcomes**: Students will receive a certificate and 3 ECTS credits for participating in the entire programme, completing an individual activity report and presenting their team-based assignment by the end of the BIP.

Detailed programme
1. 2. Planned activities during the physical component:

Students will be distributed into international small teams, and each team will study a different topic related to an urban social dimension (multi- and interculturality of Timisoara; art and cultural heritage; living conditions; students' lifestyle in Timisoara; migration, etc.)

On-site visits will take place daily from 10:00 to 14:00 with the entire group of students and teachers participating in the Summer School. From 14:00 to 16:00, we will have a lunch break and an informal discussion, debriefing, and feedback with the student teams. In the afternoons and evenings, students may organise their (re)visits and teamwork activities independently.

1st day (06/07/2026):

10:00-10:30 --- Welcome to the UVT!

10:30-12:00 --- Student groups present their university of origin and students' everyday life [**First assignment**]

12:00-13:00 --- Team-building activities [forming international teams of 4-5 students from different universities and countries of origin, getting to know each other, sharing educational background, skills, ideas and summer school expectations]

13:00-14:00 --- Preparing the fieldwork research-based activities [presenting research instruments and collecting data techniques (participatory observation grid, visual mapping guidelines), presenting the **Second assignment:** students' *Individual activity report*, students' *International Team-based activity report* - Poster]

14:00 – 15:30 – Lunch break

15:30 – 18:00 - Socio-cultural identity places of Timisoara – **ONSITE VISIT TO THE CITY CENTER AREAS** starting from the UVT: Victory Plaza – Liberty Square – Union Square – Memorial of the Romanian Revolution in Timisoara.

2nd day (07/07/2026):

10:00 – 14:00 --- Socio-cultural identity places of Timisoara – **GUIDED FIELD VISIT: DISCOVER IOSEFIN BUILD CULTURAL HERITAGE** [Piața Sf. Johann Nepomuk Preyer: Two Storey House – Alexandru Piscică Building; Piața Iosefin – Iosefin open-air grocery market; return through the Roses Park, present the New Rich and their contemporary Palaces]

5th day (10/07/2026):

9:00 – 10:30 *INDIVIDUAL ACTIVITY REPORT* - Each student completes their individual report and submits it to the BIP coordinator via email by 10:30 hours

10:30 – 12:00 – *INTERNATIONAL TEAM-BASED ACTIVITY REPORT – POSTER* – Each team of students elaborates and completes its *POSTER* and submits it to the BIP coordinator via email by 12:30 hours.

12:30 – 14:00 – *INTERNATIONAL TEAM-BASED POSTER PRESENTATIONS* – students will present the content of their team poster and conduct a Q&A session about the topic studied during the summer school.

14:00 – 16:00 --- Lunch break & Group reflective activity: Challenges and benefits of international collaborative learning activities during the BIP, including takeaways, expected impact on students' future educational paths, and personal development.
