<p>Short description of virtual component:</p> <p>The online activities consist of sessions meant to engage learners in exploring (comparatively) the rich cultural heritage of the European mountain areas of each home country of the participants.</p> <p>Presentations regarding people and places that marked the history of Romanian mountain areas in the past century, course about Romanian customs and traditions, the premises of an international audio-visual project focusing on European mountain areas in the 20th and 21st centuries.</p>
<p>Target audience / Participant profile (level and domain of study, academic prerequisites etc.):</p> <p>Students - all study levels and areas, interested in history, culture and traditions.</p> <p>Academic staff - interested in history, culture and traditions.</p>

<u>Program</u>
<p>Objectives and short description of the BIP:</p> <p>The program gives participants the opportunity to get familiarized with elements of history, culture and traditions specific to Romanian mountain areas and to exchange similar information with participants from partner universities. The program is designed in a friendly manner with interactive activities (visits, information exchange and joint projects).</p> <p>Objective 1: to get to know the most important elements of the history of mountain areas in the last century.</p>

Objective 2: to contribute to an audio-video project with information on the culture and traditions specific to mountain areas in the regions where they live/study.

Objective 3: to analyse comparative and contrastive elements of history and culture (holidays, customs, folklore, etc.).

Detailed proposed schedule (physical and virtual component):

Virtual activity: 27.05.2025 - 13.06.2025 (Total of 6 hours: Synchronous online activity, 2 hours per week)

1st week - Elements of history. People and places that have marked the history of the Romanian mountain area in the last century (Resistance movement, collectivization, the communist period, the 1987 Anti-Communist Riot from Braşov, Romanian revolution from 1989, economic changes in the post-communist era)

2nd week - Romanian customs and traditions (popular costumes – motifs and techniques, the symbolism of the sewn motifs -, socialization through joint agricultural activities, traditional dances, food festivals, village museums etc.)

3rd week - International audio-visual project. European mountain areas in the 20th-21st centuries. (proposed structure and layout of the project, interactive presentations)

Individual activity 9 hours per week (9 hours x 3 weeks = 27 hours) consisting in research on the history, culture and traditions of the mountain area of the home country (economic, social, ethnic, cultural aspects, traditions and customs, specific festivals, etc.).

19.06.2025 (8 hours):

Elements of culture and civilization. Visit to the First Romanian School in Şcheii (4 hours) - Răzvan SĂFTOIU;

20.06.2025 (8 hours):

Minimal elements of mountain vocabulary (2 hours) - Stanca MĂDA;

Elements of culture and civilization. Romanian dances (3 hours) - Stanca MĂDA;

Interactive project presentation (3h) - Georgiana ARGĂSEALĂ.

Invited guests/speakers/experts (if any):

Dr. Constantin BĂJENARU, researcher at the "Valer Literat" Museum in Făgăraș will give a lecture on history during the scheduled visit to the Museum of The Land of Făgăraș Mountains.

Remus MOGOȘ, teacher of religion, "Radu Negru" National High School in Făgăraș, will give a lecture on resistance through faith in the mountain villages.

Aurel TRÂMBIȚAȘ, coordinator of the rural museum in Beclean, will make a presentation on the role and organization of the Romanian traditional family in the mountain areas in the village museum in Beclean.
